PRESERVATION & ORGANIZATION UPDATES

We continued preservation efforts for the historical attractions located at Eldridge Park and expanded the organization to meet our growth needs.

 Alex Taylor returned to finish up paint restoration on the carousel animals. This was coordinated with the help of Community Arts of Elmira.





Started the process of relocating our Museum from the Café dining room to the Carousel Building by moving large museum pieces. We also partnered with a local collector to display his beautiful Wurlitzer Organ



 An original bumper car was purchased from a private collector and donated to the organization by Dale Bryant & Robby Robertson. It is currently at GST BOCES to be repaired and preserved to join our museum.



EVENTS & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We were able to finish off the 2022 summer season of events with a bang

- Introduced new large-scale events by giving the community the chance to meet a live memaid. 2,000 attendees were able to experience Circus Siren Pod performers at this event.
- Our Family Fun Days made a retum, redesigned as "Family Fun Thursday" with free live entertainment and 1 free attraction. We held one event each month. June was sponsored by The Chemung County Youth Bureau and featured circus performances by Elmira native Michael Dubois and his partner Viktoria Grimmy along with free Kiddieland Rides. July was sponsored by Excellus Blue Cross Blue Shield and featured creatures from Tanglewood Nature Center and free Carousel Rides. August was sponsored by M&T Bank and featured live demonstrations by Corning Museum of Glass and free Thunderbird Rides.
- Held 9 concerts as part of the Summer Concert Series sponsored by Elm Chevrolet. Then also partnered with Twin Tiers Community Orchestra to add 1 more concert to the summer season.
- Partnered with Seven Mountains Media to bring back the Fireworks event with our other event sponsors Chemung Canal Trust Company and Wegmans on Labor Day Weekend.
- Continued our regular schedule of Car Shows, as well as hosting local Food Trucks during all of our events.
- Had a successful 2nd season of our Halloween Event where we transformed the Miniature Golf Course into a fun haunted attraction. Also partnered with Near Westside Neighborhood Association to host a movie in the park event
- Coordinated with multiple organizations such as the Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 803, Italian Americans Veteran Club, to support the Vietnam Memorial Moving Wall displayed at the park.





PARK ENHANCEMENT

We continued to make improvements to enhance the park for the enjoyment of the residents and visitors across the community

- Broke ground on a brand new 2500 sq ft Splash Pad that is funded by a private donor for the community to enjoy. Projected completion is the spring of 2023.
- Tore down the old stage after it was no longer safe to use without major repairs. Started the prep work for a new stage construction at the park.
- Utilized a professional web designer to give our website a makeover. This allows us to not only showcase the attractions, but also what the whole park has to offer and its history.
- Voted #1 Best of the Twin Tiers in 3 categories: Park, Family Entertainment, and Local Event. The progress that we have made in the last 2 years has made an impact!
- Took Movie Producer Jeff Austin on a tour of our Historic Carousel and the rest of the park as he scouted new filming locations.
- Added a drinking water fountain to the outside of the Carousel Building.
- Coordinated with the Upper Susquehanna Coalition, Friends of the Chemung River Watershed, and the
 City of Elmira to plant 140 native trees & shrubs around the park as part of the Trees for Tributaries
 program.



FINANCES

This year, we were able to bring back crowd favorite events such as the Fireworks and Family Days. We were also able to expand on our programming with new events. Our expenses centered around payroll, maintenance, and general operational expenses such as utilities and insurance.




